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Workshop on 'Counselling & Classroom Management'

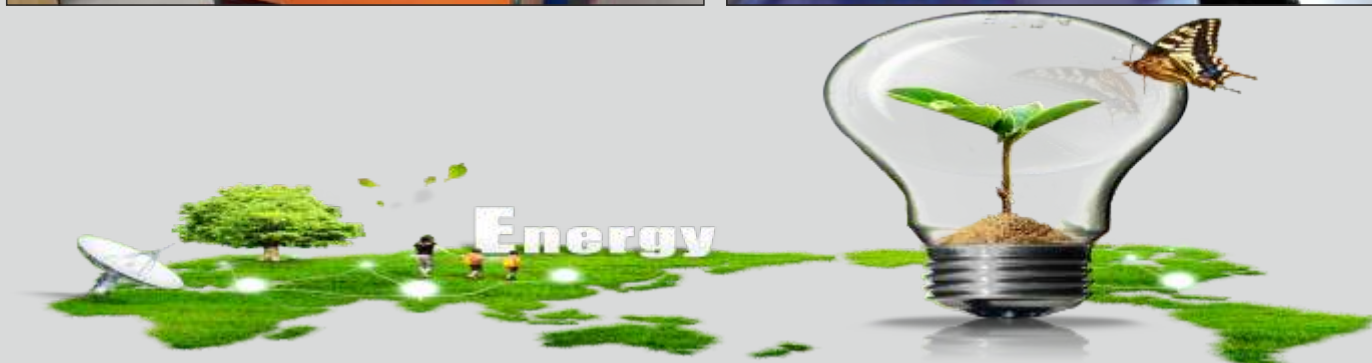
